ROAD WORK AHEAD

UNIVERSITY AVENUE PRIMED FOR STREETSCAPING UPDATE.

Next Spring, the City of Des Moines plans to begin road work on the stretch of University Avenue passing through Waveland Park. The design calls for reducing the number of lanes from four to three, including a center turn lane, and provides an opportunity for other roadside improvements.

That's where you come in: What would you like to see happen along University between the Uptown Shopping Center (at 42nd St., *below*) and the Waveland Business District (near Polk Boulevard)?

Consider bike lanes and sidewalks, traffic signals and crosswalks, signage, electrical wires, and of course, parking. If you have any pain points that could be fixed or ideas to elevate our neighborhood aesthetics, you have two opportunities to weigh in:

Sherry Borzo (SB): How long have you been neighbors of Waveland Park?

Tyler Buckles (TB): We moved to this home in 2014. Christmas decorations started growing and growing since we moved here.

SB: Tell us a little about what possesses you to decorate like this.

TB: It probably started when I was a little kid. We used to drive around and look at all the people's lights, and it was something that I looked forward to every single year. When I finally had the chance to do it myself, I thought I should pay it forward—maybe I can instill some of that Christmas magic for other families driving by. And of course, I saw the movie *Christmas Vacation* and thought, “Oh yes, this is what I need to do!”

SB: Did you have that moment when you plugged the [power cord] ends together and nothing worked?

TB: Yes, I've had that moment a few times. But now everything is on a digital timer, so I don't have to do the manual plugging-in every day. There's definitely been some times when things don't work out as planned. There's some troubleshooting involved.

SB: When do you have to start?

TB: I typically try to get started in November, right after Thanksgiving. [Last year] it was unusually warm, and I was working from home anyway, so I went out and did a little bit at a time. It was nice to do it when it was warm and I did not have to wear gloves.

reason that look just captures the Christmas spirit for me. Over the years, through thrift stores and online marketplaces, I've been able to slowly start collecting. Most of the lights are LED because of power usage, but a lot of display pieces are old school.

SB: Are your kids involved in the decorating?

TB: Yes! The six and four year old come out and help. They hold lights and they try to be involved which is
